Let's Get Creative!

Last Sunday, Pastor Susan mentioned some of the art she saw on our trip to Peru, especially the art in churches. The art in many old churches serves a teaching function, regarding stories from the Bible and stories of faith. Art can also provide a way of connecting biblical themes with local life and custom (one example from Peru is a large last supper painting in the cathedral in Cusco where Jesus and his disciples are sitting around a table where the meal appears to be the common protein of the area: guinea pig) or it can offer a twist in how biblical story is experienced. How would you express your faith experience through art? How would you share your faith—your certainties, your doubts, your challenges, your sense of connection—in an artistic format? How would you bring to life your favorite Bible story and what it means to you?

Are you willing to give this a try? You could use paint on canvas or colored pencils on a piece of paper. You could write a story or a psalm (or revisit a psalm you wrote a couple of years ago, when I invited you to write one). You could write a song or hymn. You could take photos.

Please give this some thought. If there's enough interest, we'll figure out how to share our artistic expressions in the fall.. For the summer, we'll hold several "workshop" sessions, times when we can talk about what we are working on and help each other with our projects:
