The book of Psalms covers a wide range of human experiences and the connection between God and humanity– praise, thanksgiving, comfort, singing, loss, grief, distance, alienation. There are also passages that are problematic and unsettling.

August 17– Protection; Psalm 121 August 24– Deliverance, Psalm 40:1-10
